

Performance during June, 2013

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **17** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations during the month which included an Executive Director, Oriental Bank of Commerce, a General Manager of Industrial Development Bank of India and an IAS Officer (i.e. Secretary, Health Department, Govt. of Jharkhand).
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **12** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations during the month which include the then Chairman of Railways Recruitment Board, M/o Railways.
- (iii) Commission processed **2346** complaints (including **97** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation/factual report in **160** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iv) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **153** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations which include a General Manager from Punjab & Sind Bank, a General Manager from Punjab National Bank, two General Managers from Syndicate Bank, a Commissioner of Income Tax, Central Board of Direct Taxes, a Commissioner of Central Board of Excise & Customs, a General Manager from Airports Authority of India, a General Manager (Mining) from Bharat Coking Coal Ltd. and General Manager(Env.) from Western Coalfields Ltd.
- (v) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **40** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations, which include a General Manager from Syndicate Bank and a General Manager from Punjab National Bank.
- (vi) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **79** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations, which include a General Manager of Steel Authority of India Ltd. and an Executive Engineer from M/o Urban Development.
- (vii) Intensive Examination of **6** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of Rs.35,33,50,739/- during June, 2013.
- (viii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **53** matters for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **566** All India Services and Central Services officers were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (ix) **27** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

B. Important activities:

- (i) During the month, the Commission convened Annual Zonal/Sectoral Review Meeting with the Chief Executives/CMDs and Chief Vigilance Officers of the Industries Sector on 25.6.2013. Commission emphasized to the participants on various aspects of vigilance administration for transparency and accountability in core functioning and need for undertaking systemic improvements, leveraging of technology through e-procurement, reverse auctions etc. The Commission also underscored the need for updation of Manuals, sensitization of officials by conducting training programmes, effecting rotational transfer of officials, scrutiny of annual property returns etc. Further, matters pertaining to pendency of complaints/cases, delay in processing of vigilance cases and cases pertaining to sanction of prosecution etc. were also reviewed by the Commission.
