

## Performance during January, 2015

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **6** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations during the month which include two IAS officers, one Chief Post Master General level IPoS officer of Department of Posts and an IRS officer of Income Tax Department (CBDT).
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **12** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations during the month which include one IAS officer, a Divisional Railway Manager of Ministry of Railway, two Joint Commissioners from Central Board of Direct Taxes, one Deputy Director General of Department of Telecommunications and a Director of Prasar Bharti.
- (iii) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **209** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations which include an IFS officers, a Former Ambassador of the Ministry of External Affairs, two Regional Provident Fund Commissioners from Employees Provident Fund Organization, two Executive Director level officers of Ministry of Railways, a General Manager of Bank of Baroda, a General Manager from Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. and a Group General Manager from Oil and Natural Gas Corporation Ltd.
- (iv) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **22** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations, which include an Addl. Controller, National Technical Research Organisation, a General Manager of India Trade Promotion Organisation and a General Manager from National Aluminium Co. Ltd.
- (v) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **100** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations, which include a the then General Manager from UCO Bank, one Executive Director and a General Manager from Food Corporation of India and two General Managers from Central Coalfields Ltd.
- (vi) Commission processed **3134** complaints (including **70** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation/factual report in **27** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (vii) Intensive Examination of **05** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **₹ 1072.26 lakhs** during January, 2015.
- (viii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **42** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **60** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (ix) **14** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

**Important activities:**

- (i) A delegation of the Supreme National Authority for Combating Corruption (SNACC) of the Republic of Yemen called on the Central Vigilance Commissioner to share Indian expertise in the field of combating corruption and had interaction with the Commission on 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2015.

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
