

Performance during July, 2015

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **4** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations which include an IAS officer and one Chief Commissioner of Income Tax from Central Board of Direct Taxes.
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **10** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations which include one Director of Department of Supply.
- (iii) On reconsideration, the Commission advised issuance of prosecution in one case relating to an Assistant General Manager (AGM), State Bank of Patiala.
- (iv) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **108** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations which include one General Manager of Industrial Development Bank of India, one General Manager of Oriental Bank of Commerce, one General Manager of UCO Bank, one IES officer, the then Executive Director, Central Wool Development Board, one Director of Ministry of Statistics and Programme, one Chief Commissioner of Income Tax, one General Manager of Central Warehousing Corpn. Ltd. and one General Manager of Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd.
- (v) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **4** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organization which include one Director of Delhi State Industrial and Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd. (DSIIDC).
- (vi) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **127** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations, which include one General Manager of Bank of India, three General Managers of Industrial Development Bank of India and one General Manager of Oriental Bank of Commerce.
- (vii) Commission processed **2414** complaints (including **65** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation report in **21** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (viii) Intensive Examination of **4** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **₹ 593.68 lakhs** during **July, 2015**.
- (ix) Commission provided inputs in respect of **36** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **70** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (x) **22** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

Important activities:

- (i) Shri K.V. Chowdary, Central Vigilance Commissioner and Shri T.M. Bhasin, Vigilance Commissioner attended 12th Anniversary Celebrations of Vigilance Study Circle in Hyderabad on 7th July, 2015. On this occasion, CVC said the focus of the Commission was undergoing a transformation into preventive vigilance and early detection of corruption cases so that they could be taken to their logical conclusion faster. He explained that Preventive vigilance by having systems and processes in place after identifying bottlenecks is the CVC's first priority. The core exercise is not to allow a person commit an offence and to ensure that the life of public is made smoother. One of the functions of the Head of the Organization is to ensure that his/her subordinates follow the rule and the due process of law.
