

Performance during JULY, 2017

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **2** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **23** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iii) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **85** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iv) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **13** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (v) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **250** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations.
- (vi) Intensive Examination of **07** work carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **₹ 1807.51 lakh** during **July, 2017**.
- (vii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **9** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **363** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (viii) **13** officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

Important activities:

- (i) The Commission convened Annual Sectoral Review Meetings with the Chief Vigilance Officers of **Petroleum Sector** and **Banking Sector (West)** held on 27th and 28th, July, 2017. During the meeting, Commission emphasized various aspects of vigilance administration, the need for bringing greater transparency and accountability in the functioning and for undertaking systemic improvements, leveraging of technology through e-procurement etc. The Commission also underscored the need for updation of Manuals, sensitization of officials by conducting training programmes, effecting rotational transfer of officials, as well as expeditious finalization of departmental proceedings. Further, analysis of audit reports by the CVO's and the outcome thereof, matters pertaining to pendency of complaints/cases, delay in processing of vigilance cases and cases pertaining to sanction of prosecution were also reviewed by the Commission in the review meeting.
- (ii) Shri K.V. Chowdary, Central Vigilance Commissioner, Shri Rajiv, Vigilance Commissioner and Dr. T.M. Bhasin, Vigilance Commissioner participated in sixth Anniversary celebration function organized by Vigilance Study Circle, Mumbai on 27th July, 2017.

- (iii) Shri K.V. Chowdary, Central Vigilance Commissioner as a Chief Guest, presided over an 'Inaugural Ethitalk' organized by State Bank of India at Mumbai on 28/07/2017.
- (iv) The Central Vigilance Commission's monthly lecture was delivered by Shri Shiv Khera, on 31st July, 2017 on the topic "Winners don't do different things, they do things differently".
