

Performance during April, 2014

- (i) Commission advised issuance of sanction for prosecution in respect of **5** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations during the month which include an Executive Engineer from Andaman & Nicobar Administration.
- (ii) Prosecution sanctions were issued by the Competent Authorities in respect of **7** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations during the month which include two IAS officers; the then Municipal Commissioner & the then Collector, Mumbai, an Executive Director from National Buildings Construction Corporation Ltd. and a then Commander Works Engineer (CWS) from Military Engineer Services, Ministry of Defence.
- (iii) Commission processed **2674** complaints (including **55** whistle blower complaints) during the month and sought investigation/factual report in **95** complaints from the concerned Ministries/Departments/Organizations.
- (iv) Commission advised initiation of major penalty proceedings against **59** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations which include an IAS officer; a Joint Secretary of Council of Scientific & Industrial Research, a General Manager from Canara Bank and a Joint Commissioner and Commissioner of Central Board of Excise & Customs and a General Manager (HR) of Airports Authority of India.
- (v) Commission advised imposition of major penalty against **56** officials of various Ministries/Departments/Organizations, which include three General Managers from Canara Bank, Oriental Bank of Commerce and Punjab & Sind Bank, a General Manager of National Highway Authority of India, an Additional General Manager of Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. and a Deputy Chief Medical Director from Northeast Frontier Railway.
- (vi) On the advice of the Commission, the Competent Authorities imposed major penalties in respect of **58** officials of various Ministries/Departments/ Organizations, which include an Executive Director from Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. and a Joint Director from Municipal Corporation of Delhi.
- (vii) Intensive Examination of **2** works carried out by Chief Technical Examiner's Organization resulted in recoveries to the tune of **Rs. 8,84,57,758/-** during April, 2014.
- (viii) Commission provided inputs in respect of **24** cases for vigilance clearance of officials for Board level appointments in CPSE's. In addition, references of **46** officials of All India Services and Central Services were considered for vigilance clearance in matters of empanelment, promotion etc. and inputs provided by the Commission.
- (ix) 12 officers were considered for appointment/empanelment as full time/part time CVOs in various organizations and recommendations were given by the Commission.

B. Important activities:

- (i) UNODC organised a focus group meeting as a part of a series of business sector corruption on 8th April, 2014 at New Delhi. Shri J.M. Garg, Vigilance Commissioner attended the meeting which covered the issues of integrity and probity in public procurement.
